Maverick Family,

I hope your Thanksgiving holiday was restful and filled with time to visit with family and friends. As we enter December, the attention of Madison students will be turning to end of semester activities. In some classes this may mean larger projects coming due, lengthier papers to turn in, wrapping up final units of study, and a high school and college tradition—the semester final exam. The merits of final exams have been debated for many years. One camp posits that if learning has been reliably tracked and assessed over time, not much additional information can be gleaned from a final exam. Others will argue that the final exam tests longer-term retention of knowledge. As an educational institution, final exams can provide information on two levels: (1) a summative report of student mastery of content with areas for improvement clearly identified to inform future instruction to allow for desired course-taking patterns; and (2) programmatic achievement levels for groups as a whole so that a school can monitor how well the program is meeting the needs of students. We really hope to accomplish both of these goals at Madison. Providing formative and diagnostic information to students and parents regarding overall course performance is the primary reason for final exams.

With the final exam can come anxiety for some students; in fact, the pace of the last couple weeks of class in a semester can be quite intense. While there are some sites on the web with suggestions, I have referred students to Managing Test Anxiety in the past. It is a university site but the suggestions for controlling test anxiety are general enough to apply for high school students as well. If you find that your child needs someone to speak to regarding any stress as the semester ends, please let them know that our counselors are here to help.

As you plan your schedule for this week, please be sure to look at the campus calendar on our website for the variety of events offered throughout the week.
