There is something about November that causes me to reassess my progress toward any goals that I had set for the calendar year, breathe a sigh of relief regarding the goals reached, and refocus on the specific targets that I have yet to attain. It is these periods of reflection for all of us that help to solidify the progress we have made, identify patterns in behaviors, modify the trajectories or actions that tool us off path, and pinpoint reasons for successes or failures.

There continues to be a lot of attention on the area of metacognition and its role in supporting and enhancing learning. Whether it is called growth mindset, grit, or resilience, many of us who have experienced the challenges associated with learning something that does come naturally to us, likely spent a great deal of time rethinking our own approach to the topic and sought ways to ensure we mastered the topic. At the secondary school level, these are very important college and career readiness skills to develop in our students. As a parent, you are likely working to develop these same skills in your children at home.

The top three basic strategies for all learners to master are:

- 1. Connecting new information to former knowledge;
- 2. Deliberately selecting thinking strategies; and
- Planning, monitoring, and evaluating thinking processes.

Attending to the development of these strategies in every class at every level is important. These strategies are also a critical component during homework and study time. Students can use these strategies to monitor, discuss, and evaluate their own thinking. This, in turn, can lead to improved learning.
